10. GRANT PROPOSALS:

- Exhaust Grant: Captain Batty stated that he is scheduling the painting and electrical work so that everything will be ready in January. We will need to figure a way to keep the trucks indoors while this project progresses. If we can't, we may have to push this off until the weather is warmer. EMD Martin suggested a light color for the floor so that it would be easier to see. Discussion followed. Decisions on that and others will be made this week.

11. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Chief Hall gave out new sweatshirts for all.
- Mike Hoiriis is Firefighter of the Year this year.
- 50 ft hose was donated by Chief Bates in Hancock.
- SCBA bottles – The old bottles are now starting to expire and we will start taking some out of service (expiring at 15 yrs). We still have 24 we got from Hancock. When we replace bottles, we should consider 45 min bottles instead of the 30 we have now. We should also be upgrading to new masks. The Airwash face pieces can stand 550 degrees over the 400 degree ones we have now.
- We have a new dryer coming that will only take 2 hrs to dry out gear. Capt. Borden took the PO to the Selectboard and got it approved.
- Fortunate news: We had 3 well qualified individuals apply for the Chief's job. They were interviewed and it was announced today. Rick McQuade is now 13C1tobe. Besides his extensive experience, he has a lot of availability during the day.
- Chief Hall's last day is December 30th. He asked for a leave of absence for about 3 months. He may come back and respond during the day when he's in town.
- The Selectboard has chosen to go with Wilton for the town's ambulance service. The suggestion was made to invite Steve Desrosiers from Wilton to our January meeting. EMD Martin suggested inviting others from the ambulance service too. Capt. Batty said that he would wander on down and introduce himself to them.
- Lieut. Simmons asked if Chief Hall would be our training officer. Chief Hall said that would be the new Chief's call.
- Moving forward: Capt. Batty said that Peterborough has been covering our butts with Tempsis. We have a new chart that will need to be filled out and attached to the yellow run sheet. Then Capt Batty and Mike Hoiriis will enter it into the Tempsis database. If you do not, then you will have to enter it yourself.
- EMD Martin suggested having the rug in the meeting room steam cleaned. It hasn't been properly cleaned for years. Mike Hoiriis suggested the company he used to work for, Serv Pro. Rick McQuade said that they do a good job.
- Capt. Batty thanked Chief Hall for all he has done for the department. The Chief was given a standing ovation. The Chief thanked everyone in return.
