22	Barbara C. Harris Center, on Muzzy Hill Road, submitted Lot Line Adjustment Application and

25 26	MParker opened the floor for Kelley Shaw to explain her proposal for a home-based business. KShaw explained that she has been involved in yoga and jewelry making for many years. She would like to have
20 27	a very small home-based business with 4-5 people attending yoga classes 1-2 times a week to start.
28	KShaw explained of other towns having a yoga studio but there isn't anything in the town of Greenfield.
29	She would like to have one weekend class and one class on a week day evening. KShaw discussed that
30	she has parking for 5-6 additional vehicles. As far as the jewelry side of this business, KShaw was
31	thinking of maybe just having a sign posted stating 'Artist in Residence' while she is working on the
32	jewelry. She would want to be open during the art tours. She proposed having a small permanent sign or
33	potentially a 'movable sign'. She does not plan on having any employees.
34	The planning board had a discussion regarding whether or not KShaw's proposal fit within the
35	ordinance. The planning board discussed whether or not a site plan review is needed for this proposal.
36	MParker motioned to proceed without a site plan review, as long as there are no more than 4 client
37	vehicles at one time. Seconded by RWalling. Motion passed 4-2-0.
38	The planning board asked for KShaw to complete a Business permit. The planning board then thanked
39	KShaw for her explanation and her time.
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45 7:36 pm PCC Home Based Business – R9-32 – Cameron Holt Presenting

- 46 **MParker** opened the floor for Cameron Holt to explain his proposal for a home-based business. CHolt
- 47 explained to the planning board that he resides at 10 Corliss Lane and would like to start a non-USDA
- 48 meat processing shop in a roughly 20'x26' outbuilding on the property. He explained that he is a 7th
- 49 generation farmer who has been cutting meat since he was thirteen years old. CHolt explained that he is
- 50 very passionate in what he does and takes much pride in his work and skills. He would only be taking
- 51 livestock and wild game and would not be getting into poultry at all. CHolt explained that there is a need
- 52 for professional, clean meat processing in this area. He explained that he would likely only work as
- 53 needed and gain customers through word of mouth. CHolt went on to explain that he will not have
- animals roaming around the property before being processed. The livestock would arrive in a trailer and
- 55 would stay there until humane processing. CHolt discussed RSA 21USC, Section 623-A, which explains
- the exemptions for a non-USDA meat processing shop but he must still abide by the USDA regulations as
- far as cutting and storing. CHolt would not be charging customers for the meat but instead would becharging a service fee for the processing. All animal waste would be removed from the property the
- 59 same day and would be turned into compost off site. There is room for 10+ vehicles as well as for
- 60 emergency vehicles. CHolt explained that the proposed building does have a drilled well and working
- 61 septic.
- 62 MParker motioned to have a site plan review. Seconded by RMarshall. Motion passed 6-0-0.
- 63 The planning board requested CHolt to submit a completed business application and a site plan review
- 64 application. The planning board and CHolt agreed to schedule a site walk.
- 65 **MParker** recommended for CHolt to go to the state website and look into the food regulations. **MParker**
- 66 will send him a link to the website.
