27	regulations. The select board has published an article in the Spirit in regards to items such as
28	unregistered trailers and storage containers. <b>MParker</b> then asked for some clarification from the
29	planning board in regards to Section IV of the Zoning Ordinance Letters G & Q. The consensus of the
30	planning board is that the storage containers would be allowed as long as they are past the setbacks of a
31	property (ie. If you can't build in a spot, than you also cannot have a storage container there.).
32	MParker went on to discuss the Property Tax Exempt for Commercial and Industrial Construction, under
33	Chapter 72, Title 5, Section 5 in the Zoning Ordinance. <b>DThimmel</b> will look into this ordinance within
34	other towns, reword and present to the planning board by the October 11 <sup>th</sup> meeting. The planning
35	board will vote on it, send to town counsel for guidance, have two public hearings before January 15th
36	and then present to the public at town meeting.
