22	<b>GRainier</b> explained that the ZBA will be having a re-hearing July 6 <sup>th</sup> at 7 pm, for the Gersh/Crotched
23	Mountain lot in the near future as there has been an appeal filed from their recent approval.
24	MParker stated that the select board approved the purchase of a new Dodge Charger for the police
25	department, purchased mostly from capitol reserve funds. They will keep the Ford Explorer as a spare
26	vehicle for court runs. He went on to say that Slip Rd and Old Bennington Rd were recently chip sealed,
27	which should prevent the need for pavement for roughly seven more years.
28	DThimmel explained that the first Farmer's Market went very well with great vendor and public
29	turnouts.
30	Nick Zotto expressed his interest in becoming an alternate for the planning board. RWalling nominated
31	NZotto as an alternate. DThimmel motioned to accept. Seconded by CMamczak. Motion passed 7-0-0.
32	NZotto was able to be sworn in tonight.
33	
34	7:00 pm PCC – Emergency Management Team; LED Sign Policy
35	RWalling opened the floor for Dave Martin, Emergency Management Response Team (EMRT) Director,
36	to explain their proposed LED Sign Policy. Dave Martin; Karen Day; Diane Boilard; additional members of
37	the (EMRT); fire department personnel; Liz from NH Homeland Security; Casey from Souza Signage; Ed
38	Kenny from WatchFire were all present to answer questions. Together the group explained that the
39	proposed sign will be 3'x5', in a fixed location and replacing the Smokey the Bear sign. The proposed
40	sign would be used for Emergency Management notifications, as well as, for notifications related to the
41 42	town and fire department. There would be designated personnel able to change the sign at the fire
42 42	station or remotely. The message will change as needed and will not be flashing, the brightness can be
43 44	turned down if necessary as the intent is to be informative and not intrusive. The sign would be
44 45	purchased through a grant and would not cost the town any money, they have an electrician who will donate his service and the DPW will re-compact the ground and pave the driveway. The EMRT and the

- 46 Fire Department did look into apps which have a buy in fee and require annual subscriptions. However,
- 47 they do still recommend that residents sign up for Code Red and read The Spirit. Ed explained that every
- 48 town's ordinances are a little different, his company has helped town's write a sign ordinance, as the
- 49 LED signage have become very popular. He is willing to send the planning board some examples. The
- 50 EMRT is willing to send out a Survey Monkey or town wide mailer. They are also willing to collect
- 51 signatures and feedback through sessions at the fire station.
- 52 The planning board recommends they have their own public hearings, go before the ZBA and then
- 53 before the select board. The planning board will let the select board and the EMRT know what they have
- 54 created for an ordinance edit.
- 55 The planning board thanked everyone for putting this together and for coming tonight.
